COOKIES POLICY

INTRODUCTION

A cookie is a tiny data file that is used to store information. Most websites use cookies for a number of purposes, including providing essential functionality (e.g. a shopping cart), providing useful information about the way in which the website is being used (e.g. analytics), for marketing purposes, and for many other functions such as enhanced security.

How we use cookies

The list below describes the cookies we use on the Leask Marine site and what we use them for. If you are not happy with these, then you should either not use the Leask Marine, or you should delete the cookies having visited the site, or you should browse the site using your browser's anonymous usage setting (called "Incognito" in Chrome, "InPrivate" for Internet Explorer, "Private Browsing" in Firefox and Safari etc.)

Types of cookies used

Google Analytics

We use Google Analytics to provide us with information about how our website is used, such as what countries our visitors are browsing from, and what pages are the most popular. The data gathered is anonymous and cannot be used to identify individual users.

Google ReCAPTCHA

ReCAPTCHA is a service provided by Google that allows us to confirm that only real people and not spambots are able to submit our contact forms. When you tick the box that says "I'm not a robot", Google place a cookie called NID in your browser, that communicates information such as what language your browser is set to, the date, how many mouse clicks you have made on the screen, and what other Google cookies you may have on your device. <https://developers.google.com/recaptcha>

Google Maps and Google Fonts

We use Google Maps API from Google Inc. (1600 Amphitheatre Parkway, Mountain View, California, 94043; "Google") for the purposes of providing information to help you to find us.

We use Google Fonts API to provide the font faces we use on this website.

When you use our website, some data, including your IP address, will be transferred to and stored on Google's servers in the USA. This data is used solely for the purpose of providing the service and is not

Joomla!

Our websites runs the popular Joomla! CMS and cookies are used to store basic data on your interactions with Joomla!, and whether you have logged into Joomla! if available to the user. We use a session cookie to remember your log-in for you if you are a registered user and we deem these as being strictly necessary to the working of the website. If these are disabled then various functionality on the site will be broken.

Other Third Party Cookies
